46% Councillors see rest of UK as barrier to more devolution for London

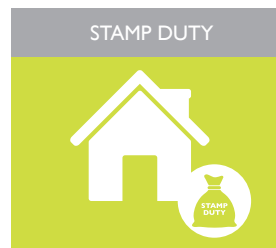
REVENUES THAT SHOULD BE COLLECTED AND SPENT IN LONDON
